PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Thank you for your interest in this our 60th anniversary report. This has been a busy year with some very weighty issues on the agenda. In September 2009, a summit to end the overpopulation of companion animals was held in Queensland, hosted by the Animal Welfare League Queensland (AWLQ). I attended with our North West Regional Manager, Caroline Dare and for the first time heard details of the AWLQ's "Getting To Zero" (G2Z) scheme. This is a very successful program where the community is asked to act in partnership with the AWLQ to achieve zero euthanasia of all dogs (and cats) except those with untreatable medical problems and for "truly aggressive" dogs. Similar programs have been successfully established in the USA across a variety of urban and rural settings.

A presentation and plan was put to the TCDL Council in November and accepted unanimously. We determined that the first of several strategies to tackle the euthanasia issue would be the formation of a Foster Care Program to assist us with the unmanageably high number of dogs coming into our Dogs' Homes each year in the winter months. Foster homes will also be of benefit to the dogs unable to tolerate confinement in our kennels for weeks at a time. A grant of \$85,000 was secured via the Animal Welfare League Qld from the Elsie Cameron Foundation to establish and operate the Foster Care Program for a 12 month period. During this time we will need to secure additional general revenue to allow us to continue this very worthwhile new venture and to ensure dogs' lives are saved. Cathy Craw was employed as our Foster Care Coordinator and has begun work with great passion. Cathy and Alan Norris, our Southern Regional Manager visited the AWLQ facilities as their guest for a week to come up to speed on "Getting To Zero" in practice. In the light of new information presented at the Qld summit, we have also rethought our Christmas puppy moratorium and will adopt as usual through this period. My thanks to our friends at the AWLQ and to the Elsie Cameron Foundation for assistance in getting this most important work started. Congratulations and thanks to Cathy Craw for her real commitment to dog welfare on all levels and congratulations to members of the TCDL Council for recognizing and supporting the most important dog welfare initiative in decades.

The facilities at the Devonport Dogs' Home have deteriorated badly over the last few years and meetings were held with the Devonport City Council to discuss upgrading the facilities.

Agreement was reached to build a new administration/reception/ staff building at the TCDL's expense and 14 new pound kennels, a new sealed and drained wash-bay area and improved roads and paths at the expense of the Devonport, Kentish and Latrobe Councils. The Administration Building is scheduled to be completed early August and all remaining work completed by October/November 2010. Our thanks to the Devonport City Council and particularly to our friends and benefactors in Devonport who wish to remain anonymous, but whose generosity has made this upgrade possible.

This year, the TCDL has been actively lobbying the state government with the review of fireworks legislation and regulations relating to the opening of car windows. These are issues affecting the welfare of dogs (and other animals) and some concessions were achieved.

Megan Alessandrini stepped down as Vice President this year and remained a Council Member. Wendy Harvey handed over responsibility to Rebecca Easton for coordinating and training volunteer dog walkers. Wendy did however fill the Vice President vacancy and took to the role with the energy and commitment with which she tackles all Dogs' Homes matters. My thanks to all three women for their ongoing hard work.

In closing, I would like to offer thanks to all our staff for the dedication they show in caring for our dogs as well as the management, administrative, fundraising, teaching and media/ communications functions without which we could not operate effectively. All readers should be aware that we are blessed with the most dedicated staff on all levels. Thanks to the Auxiliary for their ongoing hard work raising funds for the benefit of our dogs and staff and thanks to all volunteers for walking our dogs and rendering valuable assistance with ground maintenance and numerous other tasks. Thanks to our supporters who give financially and enable us to keep our doors open, and last, but by no means least, my thanks to the members of the TCDL Council who toil late into the night, wading through the myriad of problems that present themselves each month.

We continue to participate in special doggy events such as the Dogs Day Out, Dogs on the Domain and Million Paws Walk.

In October our annual Canine Commendations were awarded during the Animal Service at Scots Church. Awards were presented to veterinarian, Geoff Deans and to dog trainer, Rita Lynd for their outstanding dedication and service to dogs.

The Dogs' Homes benefit greatly from support by the media and we wish to express our appreciation for this. Tasmania's newspapers all run articles supporting our work as do local television and radio stations.

We participated in the Combined Charities, Christmas Card and Gift Shop selling our Christmas cards, calendars and other merchandise. This has been our most successful year.

Planning for the 60th Anniversary Diamond Celebrations began in July 2009 under the expert supervision of Carole Williams and the help of other volunteers. In November, a gala reception will be held at Hobart Town Hall to coincide with the Public Meeting held on 15 November 1950, when the TCDL was founded by Miss Gladys Rawson.

Last but not least, thank you all – members, staff, volunteers and members of the public for the support that has allowed us to reach 60 years of operations.

The Financial Statements of the Tasmanian Canine Defence League Inc (TCDL) show that, as required, we have managed to make some cost savings this year. Consolidated costs decreased by \$116,098 to \$1,409,295 for the 09-10 Financial Year. At the same time consolidated income also unfortunately decreased by \$33,019 to \$1,278,949. The result was a deficit of \$130,346 which represents an improvement on last year's deficit of \$213,425.

The TCDL has gratefully received bequests totalling \$89,583 this year.

- Estate of John Pool \$10,000;
- Estate of Dorothy Rowbottom \$20,000;
- Estate of Stanley Harris \$20,000;
- Estate of Beatrice Thompson – Charitable Trust. This year distributions received totalled \$35,805;
- Three smaller bequests of \$250, \$500 and just over \$3000 were also received during the year; and
- We are also aware that we have been fortunate to be included as a beneficiary in several estates currently under administration.

This year the major cost increase was insurance costs up \$7,500 on last year. The major cost saving achieved this year has been vet related costs down approximately \$95,000 principally due to acquiring the services of an employee vet in the Hobart Dogs' Home. This saving is gross; it does not take into account the employee vet's wages, which form part of the wages category in the financial report.

Public support for the Dog's Homes, in the form of donations, continues to be vital for the continuing viability of the TCDL. This financial year we were pleased to receive \$137,042 of donations. TCDL Button Day (Charity Day Collections) achieved a new best result to date, collections totalled \$11,528 thank you Margaret Cox for contributing to this event once again.

Cash and Investments have decreased to just over \$267,000 this year. This decrease is due to this year's deficit as well as investing in new infrastructure at our Devonport Home.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the staff, volunteers and Fund Raising Coordinator who have all participated in this year's successful fundraising events which have included the Christmas Card Appeal, BBQs, Raffles, Mini Markets, Quiz Night and the Dogs' Homes Calendar.

My thanks to all those who rendered financial support to the TCDL and our work with homeless dogs.

EDUCATION AND MEDIA REPORT

Our 60th anniversary year has not only provided good reason to celebrate dog welfare achievements but also an excellent opportunity to promote the organisation's goals to the wider community. To this end, media activity has focused on improving outcomes for dogs and strengthening our support base through projects and events such as the re-design of the Dogs' Home's web site, affiliation with adoption support service PetRescue, the 60th Anniversary Adoption drive and Dog Day Afternoon in the Botanical Gardens. The new-look web site is the result of many hours of work by Alex Green and we thank him for this. An adoption highlight this year was dog Misty's successful re-homing to a loving family in Western Australia. This was made possible through PetRescue, an on-line service enabling us to promote our dogs more widely. The Mercury, The Advocate and Sea FM radio in the south and northwest of the state are generously promoting our 60th anniversary drive through adoption features and weekly radio spots. This media support is invaluable in our quest to find homes for dogs. Thanks also to Bridget Bugg and Woody of Sea FM Hobart and Southern Cross TV who joined forces to produce a very appealing TV advert. From the positive feedback received, there's no doubt this advert is being seen widely – great news for those dogs awaiting adoption at the Hobart Home. The past year has also seen the production of two new colour brochures – one marking our 60th anniversary by promoting our services and goals to the community and the second providing information on making bequests and donations. Recent and exciting media highlights which can't go without mention are the happy tale of adopted dog Jessie featuring in Australia Post's Adopted & Adored stamp series and finally the launch of the Dogs' Homes 'Getting to Zero' strategy, a proud moment in the history of this organisation.

The Humane Beings program continues as our main education strategy with over 5,500 students having received the program. New resources developed for teachers have been well received both locally and further afield thanks to WSPA's promotion of the Humane Beings Picture Book Pack in their global network magazine. Humane Beings is very fortunate to have two new education volunteers leading the program at the Burnie Dogs' Home, Ann Hughes and Maureen Wayman. Other educational activities this year include an informative session on caring for timid dogs presented to volunteers and staff by veterinary behaviourist Dr Katrina Ward. Kim Wellspring, a qualified dog

trainer is also generously providing regular information sessions to staff and adopters on dog training and behavioural issues. Sheila Marrison most ably oversees the Paws for a Chat program which is enabling older citizens to connect and enjoy the company of dogs. Thanks goes also to the woodwork students at Claremont College who constructed access ramps to the Hobart Dogs' Home's education centre making access easier for those reliant on mobility aides. Mererid Roberts continues to support our educational goals through the Dogs' Homes Help Line and leading dog training sessions with Adult Education on behalf of the Dogs' Homes. Improving dogs' lives is indeed a job for us all and I thank the many people who work together with us to achieve this.

FUNDRAISING REPORT

In July 2009 the Dogs' Homes of Tasmania launched an appeal in reaction to dwindling finances resulting from the economic crisis. The response from the Tasmanian community to support the dogs in our care was overwhelming.

Following this appeal, I was fortunate enough to be chosen as the Fundraising Coordinator for the Dogs' Homes to encourage and manage further sponsorship and donations, to continue to provide first class care to our dogs and, hopefully to raise the funds needed to transform ideas into programs focusing proactively on dog welfare for the future.

To this end, there are now more ways to donate to the Dogs' Homes including an online facility through the new look website and Workplace Giving Programs for State Government employees. A number of community fundraising options are being explored such as the mobile phone recycling program that turns unwanted phones into cash and at the same time stops them going to landfill. An emphasis on tailored merchandising has also proven popular with our own brand of leads and quality products selling well. Bequests are another vital source of income for the Dogs' Homes and the dissemination of bequest brochures for future support has been a priority.

Since beginning the fundraising role, I have been fortunate to meet a number of generous members of the Tasmanian community who give their time to organise events both large and small. The Quizzer of Oz, Mr David Walch raised \$3190 in an entertaining Quiz evening, Tim Calwell-Browne donated \$2000 from the sale of his cards and McDonalds Devonport continue their kind support with \$1500 in donations to the local Devonport feed store where food and supplies are purchased. Rita Lynd donated \$320 from a dog training exhibition during the Mersey on Leven event. Several schools actively participate in our Humane Beings program and raise money and supplies from free dress days, a popular theme not only with the children – the Department of Premier and Cabinet and Tassielink also raising much needed funds in this way.

Other members of the community support us by organising fun events with their dogs including walks and breakfasts on the beach or by having a donation box in their workplace for small change.

Fundraising in 2010 began with a huge boost with the Great Moscow Circus donating proceeds from a January show in Hobart to the total of \$11,100. Many thanks must go to long time supporter Alderman Ron Christie for providing this amazing opportunity. February was also a busy month with the annual Button Day, our best ever, courtesy of our tireless and dedicated volunteers who gave their time to "shake the tin". Our very first

Dogs Day at the Botanical Gardens was also a huge success, and although not a fundraising event, we were again amazed at the generosity of those who support us raising over \$2300 in donations and sales from merchandise. In May a grant of \$2000 was secured from Rio Tinto to contribute to the Winter Heating fund for Burnie and Devonport Dogs' Homes and while other applications have been unsuccessful, grant writing will remain an important part of the fundraising portfolio.

I have enjoyed immensely getting to know some of the wonderful supporters of the Dogs' Homes and look forward to meeting many others in the next 12 months as we work together to care for dogs in our community.

FOSTER CARE REPORT

The aim of the Foster Care program is to increase our capacity to provide individualised care to dogs entering the Dogs' Homes who may require extra socialisation, time to recover from surgery or are experiencing stress within the kennel environment.

Funding to run the program in the first 12 months to May 2011 has been secured as part of the Getting 2 Zero initiative from AWLQ supported by the Elsie Cameron Foundation. Beyond this time it is hoped that sponsorship and targeted business opportunities will sustain the program.

Our Foster Care program is on a small scale in early June with five carers taking on dogs identified as requiring extra socialisation or suffering kennel stress, all carers are doing an excellent job and their houseguests will soon be ready for adoption.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The 2009-2010 financial year has posed many challenges, particularly financial ones. With a projected deficit of \$180,000 for this period and a reduction in our financial reserves due to the impact of the global economic downturn we were forced to reduce some staff hours at our Burnie and Hobart Dogs' Homes to assist in reducing this deficit to a manageable level. We have now been able to return most of these hours to affected staff but we continue to run a very lean organisation compared with similar sized mainland shelters and our staff are kept very busy in just performing routine tasks. Each year we use all but a necessary reserve to care for the dogs in our Homes and it is expected that adequate funding and staffing will remain an issue for some time to come.

This year we have successfully negotiated an Employee Enterprise Agreement which has taken several months and a great deal of time to complete. This Agreement has now been approved by Fair Work Australia and is valid for the next four years. Issues, including weekend rates of pay, are fully documented and we can now accurately predict our yearly wages budget on the basis of this knowledge.

A good deal of time has also gone into the development of a revised Occupational Health and Safety Manual and a new Human Resources Manual. These are both vital in ensuring standardised practices and approaches in the workplace and will be available to all staff electronically as well as in hard copy form. Work on a standard operating procedures manual is now in progress.

The database developed at the Hobart Home for recording statistical information re the dogs entering and leaving our facilities has been rolled out to the Burnie and Devonport Homes once we had completed a fine tuning process. This now allows state-wide statistics to be easily produced for use in reporting and grant application. The completion of this has involved much work on the development and training front by Di Andoni, our Office Manager.

As well as the larger projects being undertaken at the Devonport Dogs' Home a number of other building projects have taken place this year and our sincere thanks goes to all those who have donated their time and money to make these works possible. The projects include:

- improvements to the adoption kennels at the Burnie Dogs' Home funded by benefactors from the north-west of Tasmania who wish to remain anonymous

- the installation of heated concrete pads in the receiving kennels at the Hobart Dogs' Home ensuring dogs entering these kennels in winter will spend a more pleasant night. Our thanks to Jorgen Jorgenson and Les Linton for donating their expertise and labour with this project. It is planned to install similar heating in the kennels at Burnie and Devonport over the next 12 months with specific donations being received for this purpose.
- roofing insulation was installed in the caretaker's residence at the Hobart Dogs' Home through the Federal Government's home insulation scheme. Unfortunately the scheme was scrapped before the same could be completed in Burnie and Devonport.
- The division of a large exercise yard into two smaller yards at the Hobart Dogs' Home thus increasing our capacity to manage confinement stress for our dogs. Many thanks to our dedicated dog walkers who raised several thousands of dollars for this project.
- The concreting and division of the pound exercise yard at the Hobart Dogs' Home allowing for dogs to be exercised during their quarantine period, again reducing the likelihood of confinement stress. This project was made possible by Mr Craig Godfrey who generously donated \$6000 specifically for this work.

The Dogs' Homes have very large grounds and rely on volunteer gardening to keep them in reasonable condition. Difficulty in maintaining the mowing at the Hobart Dogs' Home was creating a potential fire hazard and snakes were seen near the administration building; these of course are major threats to our dogs. A ride-on mower was purchased from the Pound Maintenance Fund for the Hobart Dogs' Home and was trialled at the Devonport Dogs' Home. Following the success of this trial, our Auxiliary agreed to buy a ride-on mower to share between the Burnie and Devonport Dogs' Homes. My thanks to the Auxiliary and the Hobart Dogs' Home Pound Councils for these important purchases. Many thanks also to the volunteers who help maintain our gardens.

In closing I would like to thank all our staff for their hard work and dedication this year and we look forward to a prosperous New Year providing much needed care for abandoned dogs in Tasmania.

We have some good laughs together along the way while raising much needed funds to improve the life of our dogs while they are waiting to be adopted into their new homes. As always our grateful thanks to Margaret Cox for continuing to allow us to hold our meetings in her warm, comfy home.



INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2010

To the members of Tasmanian Canine Defence League Inc.

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose report, of Tasmanian Canine Defence League Inc., which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2010, the statement of financial performance for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the officers assertion statement.

Officers Responsibility for the Financial Report

The officers of Tasmanian Canine Defence League Inc. are responsible for the preparation of the financial report, and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1, is appropriate to meet the requirements of the *Associations Incorporated Act 1964* and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The officers' responsibility also includes such internal control as the officers determine is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We have conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments the auditor considers internal control relevant to the association's preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view, in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the association's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the officers, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Qualification

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practicable for Tasmanian Canine Defence League Inc. to maintain an effective system of internal control over Donations, Fundraising and other income until their initial entry into the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit in relation to donations, fundraising and other income was limited to amounts recorded.

Qualified Opinion

NOTE 1 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Associations Incorporation Act 1964 and to meet the needs of members. As these financial statements do not relate to a reporting entity there is no requirement to apply Accounting Standards or other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views) in the preparation and presentation of these statements.

The financial statements have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuation of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Pool Account disclosures are no longer included in the financial report. Due to changes with cash flow budgeting and accounting techniques operating surpluses available for capital expenditure and required capital expenditure are monitored and funded in a way that no longer requires a pool account.

As at 30 June 2010 the number of members was 555.

The League's operations encompass:

- Hobart Branch
- Devonport Branch
- Burnie Branch
- Life Subs Account
- Beatrice Thompson Account

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of these statements.

Income Tax

The League's income is exempt from income tax pursuant to Section 50-10 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 as amended.

Investments

Investments in Registered Managed Investments Schemes are valued at fair value, changes in fair value are recognised through Members Funds. Fair value is determined by the exit unit price of the Scheme for the reporting date. Cash investments are recognised at cost. Distributions and interest are brought to account when received.

Property, Plant & Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are included at cost or at independent or League Council's valuation. The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings but excluding freehold land, are depreciated over their estimated useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Properties held for investment purposes are not subject to a depreciation charge. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the League's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year together with benefits arising from wages and salaries, annual leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled. Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value.
